CONSTRUCTION, MECHANICAL AND RIGGING

Built in 1995 by Nauticat to a design by Sparkman and Stephens

Hull number 109

- White GRP hull deck and superstructure
- Hand laminated GRP with a balsa cored subdeck for increased stiffness and improved insulation
- Subdeck is overlaid with hand-picked teak planking
- Bulkheads are teak faced marine ply bonded to the hull
- Foreward coachroof is also teak laid
- Teak laid cockpit
- Navy blue sheerstrake and waterline
- Coppercoat by Symblast (2013)
- Superstructure windows are toughened safety-glass suspended in aluminium frames
- Superstructure is fastened to the hull with an aluminium toe-rail and stainless bolts
- Exterior trim is a combination solid teak and stainless steel
- Externally bolted lead ballast
- Fin keel (secured with acid-proof steel bolts)
- GRP rudder blade supported by half depth GRP skeg- rudder stock of acid proof steel supported by bronze bearings
- Air Draft approximately 15.5 metres
- Hide covered stainless steel wheel

Engine:

- Yanmar 4JH2-E 4-cylinder, 50hp marine diesel engine (1995), number 08189
- Start/stop controls with Morse lever in navigation area and Volvo control lever (at helm/ pedestal)
- VDO rev counter, oil pressure and water temperature gauges (above interior helm position)
- Engine hours approximately 1100 (as at September 2017)
- Freshwater cooling via heat exchanger and raw water inlet
- Mechanical gearbox with 2.6:2 reduction
- 30mm acid-proof steel propeller shaft driving through cast p-bracket and cutlass bearing
- 3-bladed 16" x 14" bronze fixed propeller
- Spurs rope cutter
- Sleipner 12v 4hp bow thruster with control on helm pedestal
- Fuel consumption 4 litres per hour
- Range 480 nautical miles

- 240v system supplied by shorepower and 1kw inverter (with changeover switch)
- 1 x 12v 120Ah Type 666T engine start battery (2010), (in wooden battery box, foreward)

- 2 x 12v 180Ah Varta semi-traction service batteries, joined to provide 360Ah (2016), (secured in wooden battery boxes to starboard side of engine)
- Engine and services batteries can be joined to supply 480Ah
- Batteries charged via 12v 50a engine mounted alternator
- Sterling 4-stage alternator booster
- Ellego TVA 12v 40amp battery charger with analogue Amp meter
- Vetus rotary battery charge control switch
- Rutland wind generator
- 240v and 12volt sockets throughout
- Auplint DC control panel
- Easily accessed separate fuses for bowthruster, electric windlass and domestic system
- VDO analogue Amp and Volt meters

Water System:

- Par pressurised hot and cold water system
- Water heated by 20 litre capacity engine driven calorifier or via immersion heater from shore power
- Deck wash pump, with connection in the cockpit
- Water filter fitted in cold water line (in galley)

- Fuel capacity 350 litres in 2 x stainless steel tanks (*either side of engine under saloon floor*), Port tank 169 litres, starboard tank 156 litres
- VDO fuel gauges
- Tanks independently filled with a crossover valve (under steps)

- Barton genoa tracks with Lewmar turning blocks
- Fully battened mainsail system with Seldon lowOfriction ball-bearing car system and aluminium track riveted to aft-end of mast

- Lewmar adjustable mainsheet traveller with Lewmar blocks and Spinlock jammers

ACCOMMODATION

Sleeps 5 in 2 double and 1 single berth in 3 cabins

- Satin varnished solid teak and teak faced marine ply interior joinery
- Teak faced marine ply with light wood stripping and a varnished finish on cabin sole
- White moulded head linings with teak battening
- Blue heavyweight cloth upholstery
- Blue/ purple cloth curtains

Navigation/ Helm Area (opposite saloon, starboard):

Remarks :

Nauticat 35 for Sale. JENNYANYDOTS is a beautifully presented and extremely good example of this Finnish deck-saloon sailing yacht. With all the benefits of a rufty-tufty motorsailor combined with the grace and sailing prowess of a more conventional aft-cockpit

cruising yacht, there is something here for everyone. The aft cabin is extraordinary for a boat of this size, offering space, light and decadent.

"Sparkman and Stephens, the designers or the modern Nauticats, enjoy a solid reputation among sailing yachtsman. It would be misleading to even pretend that the Nauticat 35 is in quite the same league as their more usual ocean greyhounds, but she does have some features in common with them. Her sections are deep and gently rounded, and the keel is, by today's standards, a low aspect-ratio fin. The rudder, too, is shorter and broader than the most up-to-date racing sailor might like, but the end result is a slippery and sea-kindly hull, which should be able to handle a wide range of conditions with ease yet maintain good cruising speeds.

The hull's internal depth leaves plenty of room for accommodation, requiring only a low coachroof over the forward cabin and a well-proportioned deckhouse to give full 6'4" headroom in the saloon and forecabin."

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
