Mechanical and Rigging

Construction:

Built by Northshore in late 2004

Build number 120 and launched February 2005

Designed by Robert B Harris

Hand laid GRP hull, deck and superstructure (balsa core in the top sides which stops at the waterline and plywood on deck in high-stress areas where deck fittings are located)

Treadmaster on deck

Teak capping rails, cockpit seating and slatted cockpit grating

Off white gel coat

Long encapsulated lead keel ballast (encapsulated entirely within the hull moulding)

Tiller steered

The tiller was retrofitted according to the original plans for a tiller on the V34C. The complete Lewmar/Whitlock wheel pedestal steering system, with direct linkage to the rudder, (binnacle, binnacle compass (Plastimo Olympic 135), binnacle mounted morse control, gearbox, linkages, wheel and emergency tiller) and autopilot drive (Whitlock Mamba rotary drive) are included in the sale: reinstating the Whitlock system is straightforward. The manual emergency tiller is supplied.

GRP rudder with stainless steel stock, the base of the rudder locates into the bottom of the skeg.

Deck Gear:

The side decks and coachroof are covered in Treadmaster
Ventilation is provided by opening deck hatches in the forecabin and saloon, there are also 4 x dorade ventilators. (foredeck ventilators have stainless steel frames to protect them from staysail and yankee sheets when tacking)
The mainsail and staysail halyards, the kicking strap control and staysail sheets are led aft to the cockpit and Spinlock rope clutches
Teak grabrails are fitted on the coachroof
A substantial bow roller is fitted to the bow/deck, on which the anchor will stow
Two x Lewmar, #30 self-tailing, halyard winches
Two x Lewmar, #44 self-tailing, two-speed genoa winches
Twelve x Spinlock XAS rope clutches for halyards and sail control lines

Forward Cabin:

The V berth arrangement providing two good length single berths with infill to form a double berth; infill stows between the berths to provide a seat when not in use.

There is a dressing table/vanity unit with mirror, together with a hanging locker and access forward to the chain locker

The cabin sole is made from teak and holly striped plydeck

There is a large opening perspex deck hatch above and opening portlights to port and starboard

Four x 12V lights

Heater outlet

Mattress pad/topper for V-berth; fitted sheet and mattress pad cover; V-berth duvet

Heads/shower compartment:

Positioned aft of the forward cabin to starboard

GRP basin vanity unit with hot and cold mixer tap/showerhead

Shower tray grating; Electric pump out of waste shower water

Jabsco marine toilet with hinged down lid over; Holding tank selector (new pump and hoses 2018)

Deckhead mounted ventilator

Opening portlight

Mirror forward

Saloon:

Dinette/C-shaped seating which converts to a double berth to starboard, with fitted Lee clothes

There is a single settee berth positioned to port, with fitted lee cloths

Twin leafed saloon table on centreline, around the teak mast support post

Bookshelves and four lockers outboard,

Cocktail cabinet with bottle and glasses stowage

Hanging locker forward with shelves

Teak and holly striped cabin sole, faced on marine ply

Deckhead mounted ventilator; Opening and fixed portlights

Opening roof/deck hatch

Navigation Area:

Positioned to starboard

Opening portlight

Full-sized chart table with chart stowage

Navigator's seat with top access locker outboard

Upper shelf storage outboard

Two x cave lockers under outboard

Locker under opening inboard

Electronics to hand; Ships electrical AC/DC panel

Top loading refrigerator under the chart seat

The quarter berth is positioned aft of the chart table to starboard

L-shaped galley to port

Plastimo Neptune 2000 two-burner gimbaled gas cooker, with grill and oven

Double stainless-steel sink with hot and cold pressurised water supply and fitted teak chopping board

Manually pumped fresh water supply

Work surface, plus drop in piece over the cooker, to make an additional work surface

Opening portlight

Two x 220V sockets

Sliding door lockers outboard

Three x plate stowage drawers outboard

Positioned aft of the galley to port

Hanging wet locker for waterproofs engine cooling water inlet

Companionway:

The companionway steps are removable which allows access to the engine and incorporate a locker for storage of winch handles etc.

Solid teak grab rails either side of the companionway

Cockpit:

Cockpit is integral with the deck moulding and it has two large lockers, one to port and one aft

Two drained gas bottle lockers are fitted either side of the cockpit

There are two large cave lockers in the coamings

Two large diameter cockpit drains exit via the stern

The cockpit floor has a teak duckboard and the cockpit seats are teak laid

Companionway: hatch – Perspex (with carry/storage case); timber (for winter use)

Remarks :

The Vancouver 34 Classic is a true offshore cruiser, she is a go anywhere yacht that makes an ideal passage maker. Her interior fit-out has been designed with passage making in mind with good sea berths and compact galley layout, yet she is still very comfortable in harbour. She has a full-size forward-facing chart table which is excellent for passage planning. The Vancouver 34 Classic has a well-balanced sail plan: she is capable of high speeds and passage times over extended periods.

This Vancouver 34 Classic is an extremely good example. The current owner has upgraded

her over the past 4 seasons, including new instrumentation with two Raymarine chartplotters, radar, AIS, Raymarine autopilot, Rutland wind generator and Hydrovane self-steering system. The battery bank has been replaced and upgraded, various USB 12V sockets added throughout the vessel and internal and external LED lamp conversions. The standing rigging which was replaced in 2014, and sail inventory has been extended, with a new reacher (2016/17) and new gennaker (2015). The Yanmar 3YM30F engine is sufficient for the size of the vessel and has always been annually maintained, and the stern gear comprises of a three blade varifold bronze propeller, with ambassador rope cutter. The condition of this yacht throughout is excellent, she is very well maintained and equipped ready for a new owner to just step onboard.

Owners Remarks:

Samphire was purchased from Northshore shipyard in late 2014; she had been moored off Itchenor since built. She was serviced over the winter and upgraded in line with the surveyor's report: including slurry blasting to remove the build-up of antifouling and epoxy coating, replacing standing rigging and replacing various through hull fittings. The liferaft was moved on deck and an original self-tacking track was added for the staysail.

Samphire was sailed west during the summer of 2015, to find a new home at Mayflower marine. Since 2016 she has been sailed extensively in the South west and the channel.

In early 2017, a tiller system was retrofitted to make short-handed/single-handed sailing simpler. The original designer drawings were provided by Northshore and the fittings for the rudder stock was made by the original manufacturer. All the original fittings for the Whitlock system were retained: refitting the wheel system is straightforward.

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
