Mechanical and Rigging

Construction

Isotalic polyester sandwich construction by infusion process with multiaxial glass fabric, core material is 20 mm divinycell, solid laminate around the keel, rudder and through hull fittings. Hull and deck are white with dark blue waterline in NPG - based gelcoat.

2013 Copper Coated

Open Transom with bathing platform

Robust protective Hull Covers made by Sanders Sails

Structural Bulkheads

Marine plywood securely bonded to hull and deck

Galvanised Steel Cradle

Made of hot galvanised steel, the frame takes up the dynamic loads of the hull, mast and rig

Keel & Rudder

The keel consists of a lead bulb and a cast iron fin to maximise righting moment The fin is protected with a layer of glass fibre, faired with polyseter filler and is bolted to the hull and stell frame with 12 x 20mm stainless steel bolts.

Rudder blade hand laminated multiaxial glass. Rudder stock 80 mm aluminium tapered at both ends, self aligning needle bearings.

Mast & Rigging

Mast - Silver anodised aluminium 227 x 119 mm Height 18.9m Keel stepped The mast is fitted with 3 spreaders, 19-ply stainless steel wire standard rigging, streaming light, deck light and is prepared for spinnaker equipment

Stainless steel chain plates bolted to the longitudinal arms of the galvanised cradle Boom - Silver anodised aluminium 171 x 94 mm Internal ouhaul and single line reefing system
