The Dehler 36 CWS is a well-built, modern sailboat, particularly suited for the short-handed sailor. The boat features a central electric winch, a central electric port winch, and a central electric starboard winch. The cabin is forward, with a linear galley to port and a linear head to starboard. The boat is equipped with a variety of accessories.

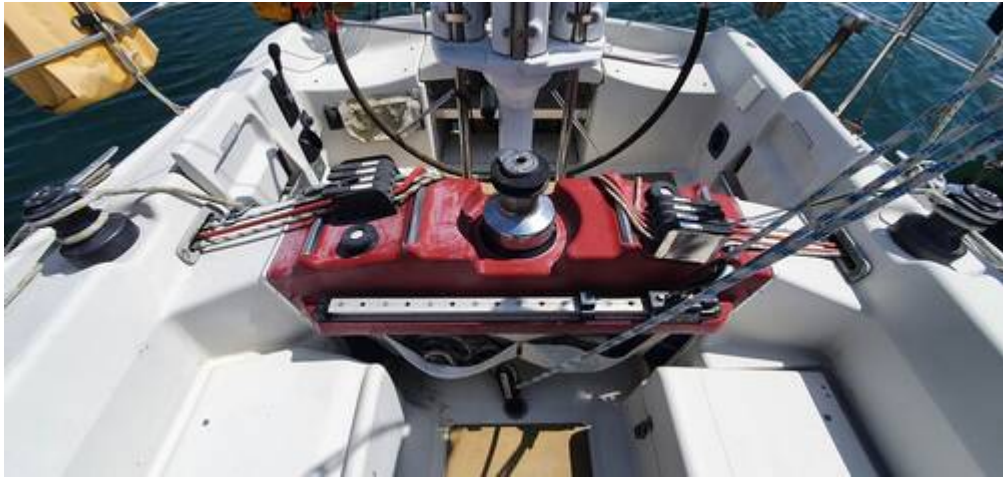

Feature of this yacht is the central sheet winch control with primary Lewmar winch controlling sheets and reef lines. Clutches beside the winch on the bridge that is adjacent to the helmsman to facilitate single handed sailing. The benefit of this system has been documented by John Oakley who has reviewed the 36CWS "A perfectly balanced sailing yacht to windward, Dehler introduced dramatic changes with the design of this yacht"

Accommodation

With wide flat "Deck Strip" covered decks the yacht is easily worked.
Large cockpit with spray hood, side dodgers and pop-on seat cushions.
Aftward ship in the cockpit is the bridge with central Lewmar 43 self tail electric winch with the clutches for running rig on either side. This is a clever innovation that greatly assist with the control of the yacht from the cockpit when shorthanded.
2 X Lewmar 30 self-tail two speed spinnaker winches.
Whitlock Cobra steering system with stainless steel wheel and instruments on the binnacle.
Silva dome compass.
Dorade vents on coachroof with stainless tube protectors.
There are two flip up seats at the helm.
Anchor locker forward with "Quick" electric windlass with remote control.
Stern boarding ladder.

Interior:

"Moonpath" offers a bright and spacious saloon with large saloon table with seating on three sides.
Opposite is the linear galley with three-burner cooker, twin sinks and fridge below.
The long work top provides plenty of work top with cupboards above and below.
Starboard aft is a double cabin with dressing seat.
The navigators desk is to starboard with instrumentation and folding seat.
To port the spacious heads with shower, Jabsco toilet and washbasin pigeon holes.
All portholes have blinds.
Eberspacher Warm Air Heating System.
Water heated by calorifier.
Forward is the spacious owners cabin with heads and privacy curtain.
All cabin doors have storage shelving & netting.

Remarks :

"Moonpath" is a Dehler 36 CWS cruiser designed for short handed sailing. CWS represents the "central winch system" with a primary electric winch near the helm with all control lines lead to this convenient accessible location for the helm. The furling fore sail is on a self-tack track. There is a Stack Pack fully battened main sail on roller cars to facilitate ease of hoist & drop. There are two heads below deck with owners cabin forward with heads. The main saloon is bright and spacious with linear galley to port and a large saloon table with surround seating on

three sides. One cabin aft and a second heads.
"Moonpath" has served its owners well for Summer
cruising however has not been used in recent years.

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
